Healthcare in the UK

- Most international students use the state funded National Health Service (NHS). The NHS includes community and hospital services.
- If you are a Student Route visa holder and you have paid the immigration health surcharge as part of your visa application, you are entitled to NHS care while studying in the UK.
- If you are a visitor or if your visa is shorter than 6 months, you will need to get a private medical insurance for the duration of your stay.

Register with a GP

GP = General Practitioner (Doctor)

- You should register with a GP as soon as you arrive in the UK. This is important as you can't book an appointment to see a GP unless you have registered.
- If is your responsibility to complete the registration form and email it to the right GP. If you are unsure what to do, our nurse health advisers are happy to assist.
- Do not go to a local hospital unless it is an emergency (Accident and Emergency) Department) or if your GP/111 service tells you to go there.

- This document contains information about your Student Route Visa and it explains, in particular, how your attendance at University will be monitored and how you can make sure your visa remains safe and is not cancelled.

BRP Collection

BRP = Visa

- Some Student Route visa holders need to collect their Biometric Residence Permit (BRP) from Portsmouth.
- You can find the exact instructions on our Moodle page.
- EEA and Swiss nationals and UK based visa applicants with a Student Route visa do not need to do this as you already have a digital status.
- Visitors (short-term exchange and study abroad) do not have to do this.

BRP End Date Information

IF YOUR BRP EXPIRES ON 31 DECEMBER 2024...

- You do not need to tell UKVI if your BRP expires on 31 December 2024 but your immigration status (for example, your visa) allows you to stay longer.
- You will not need a BRP from 1 January 2025. You'll be able to prove your immigration status online, without a BRP.
- You must create an online eVisa account as soon as possible.





ID Check (Registration)

chiview.chi.ac.uk

- Visit Academic Registry (in University House) with your visa (BRP)* and passport ** as soon as possible.
- If you are based at the Bognor Regis campus (BRC) and are unable to travel to Chichester, please visit the International Advice Office in Bognor Regis (25 and 26 Sept OR 30 September and 1 October)
- What to take with you?: Passport and eVisa share code OR Passport & Entry Clerance Vignette/BRP. If you have an eVisa and a BRP, you do not need to show your BRP to us.
- You are not considered fully registered until you have done your ID check.

*Short-term visitors need to show their passport and evidence of arrival.



Travelling (By Bus)

- The University U7campus bus timetable is available via bus.chi.ac.uk
- U7 bus is free for students. Simply show your student card/ChiView student page when entering the bus.
- If you wish to use other public transport services, please note that it will be more expensive.

U7 operates between Monday - Friday!

Opening A Bank Account

- Decide which bank you would like to bank with.
- Complete your registration (next slide).
- Log in to your ChiView account > printable documents >add your bank details > print your letter (colour).
- Make sure your ChiView record states your home (abroad) and term-time address (UK).
- Visit the bank/apply online


